Premier Charter School + Duo Dog Mario February 16, 2024









DUO TEAM MEMBER SPOTLIGHT: DUO'S CHIEF CANINE OFFICER CRISSY SMITH


Crissy Smith is a pillar within the Duo community. Starting as a puppy raiser in 2005, being asked to become a staff trainer in 2012, and now as the Chief Canine Officer, Crissy has helped pave the way for the programs we have today. As the CCO, Crissy is responsible for all aspects of the Assistance dog program including the health and welfare of the dogs from breeding through retirement, enrichment and training for program dogs during the first two years of their life, and providing quidance and training to the volunteer puppy raisers, staff, and clients. Training for the humans is just as important to the program as training for the dogs and Crissy takes the time to answer questions day-in and day-out from all of us! Crissy's favorite parts of her work include training with the dogs and teaching people how to work with the dogs but even more so getting to see the "it" moments - that excitement from the dogs when they achieve a new skill or the joy when a client sees just how much the dogs can do. While her days bring different situations, challenges, and interactions, Crissy loves that Duo has always felt like a community, coming together both personally and professionally to help and support each other.



During Crissy's time away from the office she loves hanging out at home and spending time with her animals: Duo Dog Evie (Duo's Ambassador dog), Ginger (a retired Duo breeding dog), and her cat Willie. Her hobbies include painting, creating and making jewelry, collecting beads, and gardening.
